
Content based instructional learning model and an enhanced curriculum that combined a service learning curriculum and an English immersion program

Develop a basic diagnostic and treatment service center supported by highly trained professional medical personnel

WHY THIS MODEL?

- **Schools and medical centers are complementary social services. Both require professional attention to critical social needs. Physically and functionally linking the two makes them far more efficient and effective.**
- **There are numerous examples that suggest that school attendance, parent involvement in the schools, prenatal, newborn and adolescent care are markedly improved by the physical and functional link.**
- **Parents, particularly men, who participate in bringing their child to and from school, are far more likely to avail themselves of medical services than they would otherwise because the proximity of the medical center and the fact that it is a familiar entity.**
- **The school has a focus on medical services. The medical center will act as a learning laboratory for students who attend the school.**

SEPTEMBER 2018

NAD's private elementary school impending opening is scheduled for September 2018, and aims to initially enroll three cohorts ranging from kindergarten to third grade. Gradually, as each subsequent academic year progresses, NAD plans to add the next required grade until it reaches to full elementary school program (K-12).

MARCH 2019

Launching in March 2019, the medical center responds to the need for quality preventive and primary medical care, which is both accessible and affordable to the people who live and work in the city of Labé, Guinea.
